CARE OF UNIFORMS:

1. Choir uniforms are only to be used for <u>Horlick</u> choir events. You are not to use this uniform or any of its pieces for dances, church programs, or for personal use. Do not mark the clothing or cut off any of its tags.

- 2. Your uniform should be washed (excluding tuxedo jackets) between concerts. However, do not use bleach. Please wash with like colors in cold water. You may also machine dry. To avoid wrinkles, please hang uniform in a closet to store between concerts. Do not leave your choir uniform in the trunk of your car.
- 3. Lost choir uniforms must be replaced at student's expense (approximately \$60-100). Never leave your uniform in the choir room or any public area. Please arrive at concert fully clothed in uniform. Apply make-up at home to avoid staining accidents.
- 4. Pants are <u>not</u> to be worn under skirts. Students are responsible for HAND SEWING the skirt hem. This takes a LONG time; but, do not machine stitch! The skirts should be worn on the natural waist not low and the hem should just touch the floor. Women should wear black flat heeled shoes/slippers with black socks. No flip flops or piggy toes showing.
- 5. Rebel men are to purchase and wear black <u>dress</u> pants. Wind pants, black jeans or casual sportswear will not be acceptable. Pants should be worn on the natural waist not low and should not be baggy. HAND SEW pants hem. Black shoes will be worn with black socks. Shirts are to be ironed and tucked in. Please have your necktie tied before arriving at the concert.
- 6. Chorale men should have bow tie and vest to complete tuxedo. Please check that they are in your possession <u>before</u> leaving home. Bow tie can be stored in the internal jacket pocket between concerts. Black dress shoes will be worn with black socks.
- 7. Chorale women must HAND SEW the uniform hem. Do not cut the fabric.
